The Associate of Arts in History offers a well-rounded general education degree, including a concentration in history courses, which prepares students for transfer to four year institutions. This degree provides foundation for long range goals in higher education in preparation for careers in secondary and college teaching, public history and archival work, law and government service, etc.

If you are a part-time student or have transferred courses from another college, you should plan to complete the courses listed under Semester I before taking the courses listed under Semester II and so forth. Please see an advisor for sequencing and course substitution questions.

 You will need to demonstrate proficiencies in reading, mathematics and English based on SMC assessment tests, ACT or SAT scores, or by taking the recommended classes. This degree can be adapted for various transfer institutions. Please contact your advisor to determine specific course requirements at the receiving institution prior to selecting options or electives.
