### CLEP Test Information

Southwestern Michigan College is a testing site for CLEP (College-Level Examination Program). You do not need to be a student at SMC to take a CLEP test here. You may have the scores sent to SMC or to another institution. Southwestern Michigan College accepts CLEP credit. If you are planning to send your scores to another institution, it is important that you contact that institution and ask if they accept credit for that test, what course it is for, and what score they consider as passing. SMC accepts the standard scaled score on all tests, which College Board recommends. See the list of tests and SMC equivalents to determine which courses and how many credits you can receive with each test.

CLEP offers 33 tests and all are internet based. There is a study guide in each Testing Center. This study guide is also available in most public libraries and bookstores. Practice tests and additional information is available on the CLEP website at <https://clep.collegeboard.org>.

CLEP requires that a candidate must first register and pay via “My Account” College Board website prior to testing. A \$20.00 fee will be collected at the time of testing, this fee must be paid by cash or check, payable to SMC. We do not accept credit or debit cards for the service fee.

To register with CLEP, log into <https://clepportal.collegeboard.org/myaccount>:

- Create an Account through the “My Account” Registration Portal.
- Select the test you wish to take and pay for it.
- Locate the Testing Center you prefer to test with and select your score recipient institution.
- Print the CLEP Exam Registration Ticket that is required to take the test.
- Contact the Testing Center for an appointment to take the test.

Listed below are the items required to bring with you on the day of testing:

- Two CLEP approved forms of identification (a primary and secondary)
  - The primary form must be a government-issued photo ID with signature. (i.e. driver’s license)
  - The secondary form must have either a photo or signature. (i.e. current student ID)
- The printed CLEP Exam Registration Ticket

CLEP exams are available by appointment only. Please allow at least 3 hours for testing.
